When the lolly-lions saw the dence, they knew their lillypop-stealing days were over. From now on, the lolly-lions would have to negotiate with the village.



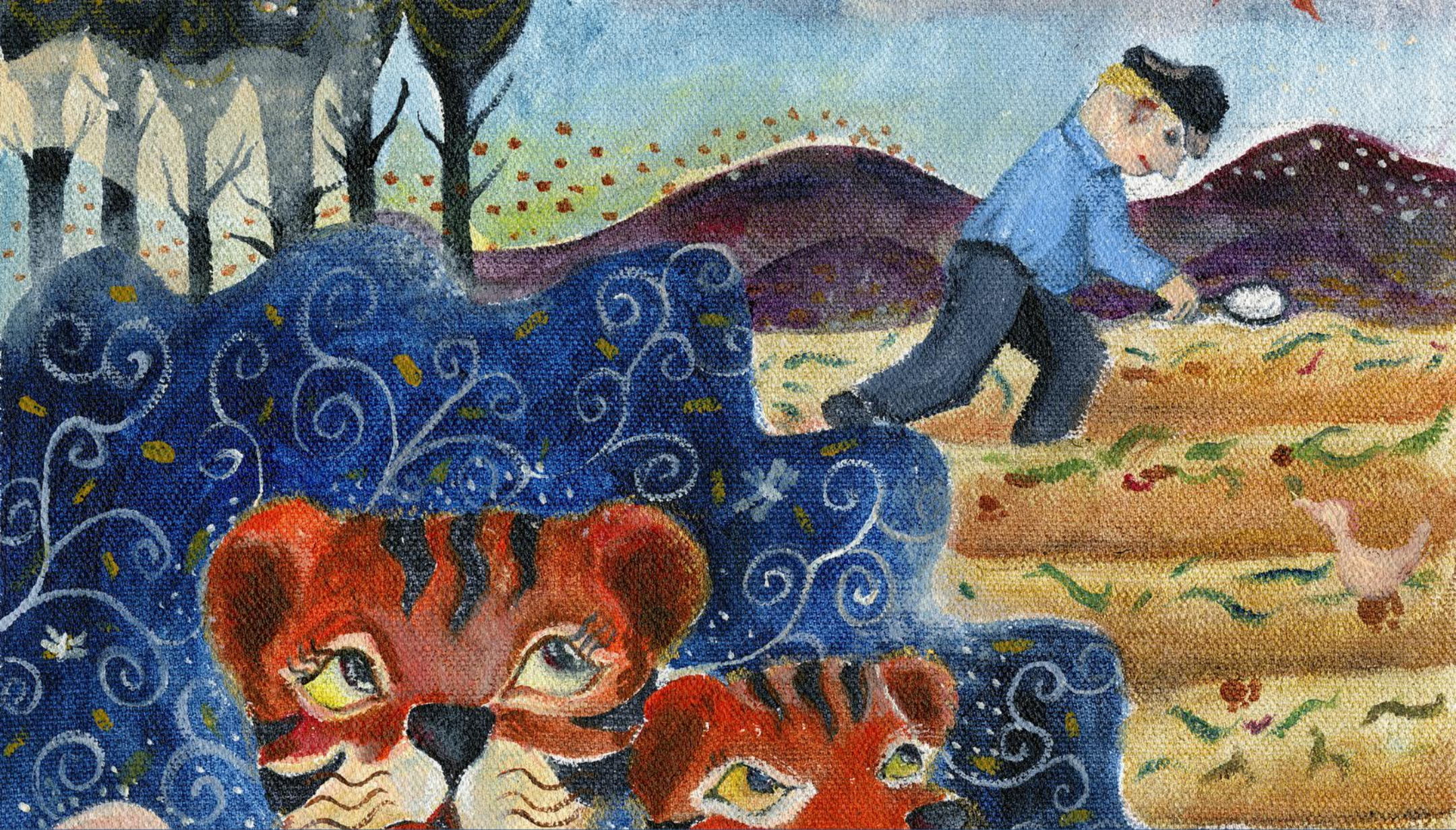

So, each of the sneak-snakes explained why they would be the best leader. Then everyone voted. Over time the village made a lot of progress.



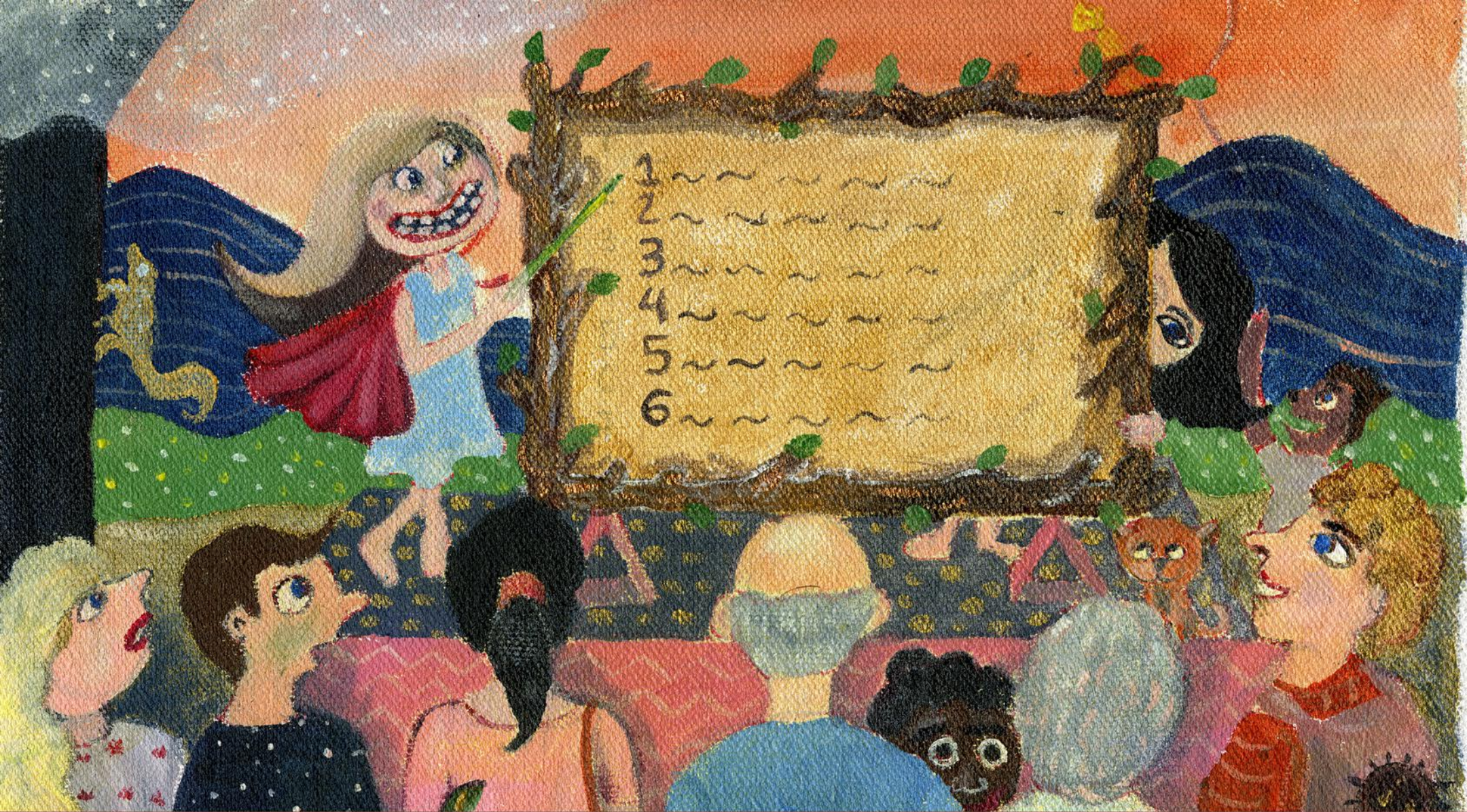
